### **Description**

The seminar is a part of the long-term IFSH-project on building up an academic network in Southeastern Europe. The project is supported from funds of the GES-support program as a part of the stability pact for Southeastern Europe. Besides students of the master course (obligatory for all persons receiving a GES scholarship, open to others), also other interested students from various German universities participate who in most cases themselves come from Southeastern Europe and partly are working together in the initiative "Students Build Bridges".

The first part of the seminar is on the subject of intercultural communication as well as on further developing the network concept (see own description). Based on the learning results, in the second part of the seminar there will be a workshop in the region, in Belgrade or Novi Sad (the number of participants is restricted to 12 M.P.S.-students). Here, knowledge of the current security political situation, of writing history books or of the historic review of the conflict, and of how the minority problem is dealt with shall be acquired and the problems of post-war societies – also referring to "reconciliation" – shall be critically analysed and questioned within the regional context. Personal engagement in the work of the network shall contribute to peacefully solving conflicts in the region.

Students who cannot take part in the workshop still have the possibility of achieving two points by attending only the first part of the seminar. Attending the second part of the seminar without having attended the first part is not possible.

Four points can only be achieved if both parts were attended.

The aim of the course is for the students to gain insights into the genesis of historical and political foundations of foreign policy and regionalism in Asia. This includes the discussion on theory and methodology in the analysis of the region's foreign and security policy. Geographically, the course will focus on the Pacific Rim and Southeast Asia (incl. China) in particular. The students shall get insights about historically contingent forms of foreign policy and regional order during the past and in contemporary affairs. The course will start off with the colonial legacy, liberation movements and the tasks of state-building. The dealings with the evolution of foreign policy during the Cold War will include the foundation of the Third World ('Third Estate') at the Bandung Conference in 1955 and the problems these countries faced in protecting their sovereignty. In this context, the problem of balancing domestic development and social heterogeneity on one hand, and the imperative of stability and well-balanced external relations between the blocks on the other, shall be highlighted. The study of the evolution of Asian regionalism will draw upon these insights. The foundation and principles of ASEAN shall be analysed in the context of regional conditions. Furthermore, the course will deal with post-Cold War developments and the changes in Global structures and regional security.
